

The Limington Transfer Station is **solely** to be used by the residents of the Town of Limington and for the residential solid waste generated within Limington.

All Transfer Station decals must be displayed and permanently affixed to the vehicle's windshield.

Decals are available from the Town Clerk's office during regular business hours.

Transfer Station attendants may turn away vehicles without valid decals, or patrons who refuse to comply with the Limington Solid Waste Ordinance.

Residential demo is limited to two (2) cubic yards per month. Contractors are not authorized to off load at the Transfer Facility. Residents with large remodel or demolition projects should contract private haulers.

Disposal Fees:

The Transfer Station considers one load from a pick-up with 6-foot bed to be two (2) cubic yards.

Paint:

Can be recycled by Paint Retailers

Automotive Batteries:

CIA will pay you for batteries

Recycle Items = SAVE MONEY

Paper and Cardboard:



All clean cardboard, pizza boxes, paperboard, advertising inserts, newspapers, catalogs, phonebooks, magazines, books.

Clean paper plates (not soaked or caked with food or oils), milk cartons, juice cartons, drink boxes and wrapping paper that can rip.

Plastic Containers Marked #1 - #7:



Including but not limited to: water bottles, drink bottles, milk jugs, takeout food containers, prepackaged food containers, detergent bottles.

NO STYROFOAM! NO PLASTIC BAGS!

Metal Containers:



Including but not limited to: tin cans, aluminum cans, tin foil (not caked with food residue), pots and pans. Aerosol cans such as shaving cream and hair spray must be completely emptied.

Glass: Including all glass bottles & jars

All above containers should be empty. They do not need to be perfectly clean but should be lightly rinsed.
